Meeting Notes - October 10th

President Donna encouraged Rotarians to donate baking for the Interact club's "Your Move" fundraiser set for Saturday, October 13th. Steve Jackson, from the Nanaimo Marine Rescue Society, was presented with a cheque for \$1,000 from Daybreak Rotary - Steve advised that the boathouse for the rescue boat will be located near the Brechin boat launch and that it will be in service by the end of 2007. We were also told that last year the Nanaimo Marine Rescue Society responded to over 80 calls. Nelson Allen announced that Daybreak Rotary will be donating \$500, which Nicole Gosselin will be using to purchase medical supplies in Ethiopia.

Rod Mont, for his Rotary Minute, gave an update on Polio Plus. Before eradication efforts began in 1988, polio paralyzed more than 1,000 children per day - this number has dropped by more than 99%. Only four countries are still polio endemic. Rotary International is the largest private sector donor for the Global Polio Eradication Initiative.

Alita Dancy, president of the Interact Club, was selling "Your Move" t-shirts at the meeting. Last year, the Interact Club raised \$10,000, which was enough to send 102 AIDS orphans to school. Students in the schools are supporting the t-shirt sales. Rod Mont announced that the Summer Song committee will be meeting at Sands at 4 pm on Tuesday, October 16th to discuss what went well and what needed improvement at this year's Summer Song. The meeting will also consider recommendations for next year. Anyone who wishes to provide feedback about Summer Song is welcome to attend.

Jim McIvor made several announcements regarding the Grey Cup party. There are two sets of tickets to sell. The first set is the Grey Cup pool. There are 100 tickets which cost \$50 each. Half of the money raised from the pool will be paid out in prizes based upon the scores of the final three games of the playoffs. Nicole Gosselin handed out two tickets for each member to sell - all sales of these tickets must be made by November 10th since the semi-finals will be held on November 11th. The second set of tickets are the tickets to the actual Grey Cup party. There will be a total of 175 tickets for sale at \$25 each which includes one drink and a steak dinner.

Moira Steele advised that the date in the Weekly Wake-up regarding the spa weekend was incorrect... the group is leaving on October 19th.

President Donna thanked Ron Blank for building a storage box for the Rotary gear. We now have a place to store our things while at Mom's Cape Breton Kitchen. Thanks, Ron!
