

So if you would like to pitch in and help provide shelter to Haiti, we need to fill 12 positions.



# Meeting Notes—January 20th

True to the spirit of Rotary, the biggest business transacted at Daybreak Rotary's January 20 business meeting was to help those in need - and bringing in a new member who had already joined in a world service meeting.

Before we got to the business of helping people, we reaped the results of past contributions. President Dave reported receiving a thank-you letter from the Rotoplast for the club's \$500 donation. The donation helped children in the Phillippines with reconstructive surgery. The final \$3,000 payment was made to the Nanaimo Museum project. Ken Hammer presented a thank-you certificate from an orphanage in Ghana that has been supported by Daybreak donations.

Denise Larsen is seeking new ideas for service projects. There will be a presentation on Literacy at the Feb. 3 meeting.

# Celebrate Rotary Awareness month & Rotary membership Secretary Eileen reported that January is Rotary Awareness month and a good time to bring in new people and increase awareness about Rotary. Speaking to membership, Rod Mont said more than 100 people had left the club since it was chartered, demonstrating the need to add new members every year. He estimated an average of 8 members leave the club each year

The club welcomed its newest member, Barbara Denike, who was inducted into Rotary. A retired teacher, she also enjoys sewing, pets, working on her two-acre property in Cedar and volunteering to help seniors. She has 3 children and 2 grandchildren (but certainly doesn't look old enough to have grandchildren.)

# Earthquake in Haiti

Relief efforts to help the people of Haiti were at the top of everyone's mind, with several people remarking that they held off donating until they knew what the Rotary response was to be. President Dave reported that Rotary had established an NGO (non-government organization) called the Haiti Earthquake Relief Fund on the ground in Haiti to handle Rotary donations and ensure the help reached those in need. Shelter Box had more than 3,000 shelter boxes enroute in addition to more than 100 aquaboxes to provide safe water.

Don Bonner and Chris Everett urged the club to purchase an additional Shelter Box - plus the one already in the budget - to help in Haiti. After some discussion and concern about the budget, club members agreed to allocate another \$850 to purchase two Shelter Boxes. An envelope was passed around and by the end of the meeting, an \$1,250 had been collected - more than enough to purchase a third Shelter Box.

# **Upcoming events**

A fellowship evening was announced for Thursday, Jan. 21, at Longwood Pub.

Bill Brendon consulted the club on a date for the next Daybreak Poker Tournament and decided on either March 7 or 14. Buy-in is \$50 - spread the word so we can sign up more players. If there are not 40 tickets sold by March 8, the tournament will be cancelled. Denise Larsen will not be available to handle food for the event. so another volunteer is needed.

Swing into Spring will be held March 27 at Bowen Park Auditorium. Organizing is underway and a meeting will be held in the coming week.

Wendy reported that Daybreak has met all of its Bingo commitments and has applied for a renewed license. The club won't know until March whether it has been approved for Bingo fundraising.
