Rotary Minute - Darryl Stech advised the meeting of the duties of a Sgt. @ Arms

Ken Hammer presented Brian Kirkhope with the new "Nanaimo Rotary Daybreak Award of Excellence" trophy in recognition of his tenure as District Assistant Governor for the period 2007-2009. Ken advised that he had obtained the trophy in a previous Christmas Rotary auction when it had been purchased in his absence. Ken suggested that trophy will be circulated through the club for exceptional service by club members, as selected by the previous winner, and that they should display the trophy in a prominent place at home.

Brian Kirkhope presented the trophy to Christine McCauley so that we can see the trophy at her house on Saturday.

Daryl Stech advised that we need a work party September 25, 2010 for the Habitat for Humanity to complete some landscaping.

Patrick Maguire informed the meeting that:

- the Nanaimo Rotary Clubs have bought two 10x10 tents with Rotary Logos on them at a cost of \$200 per tent and each club can book them;
- the board had considered joining the Chamber of Commerce for greater exposure but on further consideration they decided not to join;
- another Rotary club without proper authorization had been soliciting cash contributions from motorists at four stop lights in Nanaimo. This activity resulted in complaints to the city and a by-law officer attended one location and shut it down.

Ron Blank advised that Readingtree.ca has placed 9 boxes throughout Nanaimo for the collection of books. These boxes make reference to Rotary, giving the impression that they are affiliated with our organization which is not the case. These competing collection boxes will have an impact on our club's ability to collect books for Literacy Nanaimo. Last year our collection of books raised \$40,000 for them.

Patrick Maguire recapped the issues relating to the organizations - Shelter Box Canada and Disaster Aid Canada.

NOTICE OF MOTION

The second signature may be that of the President, Treasurer, Secretary, Past President, Vice President or President-Elect.

Patrick McGuire also advised that the Board considered implementing a Continental Breakfast at a reduced cost but decided not to move forward with this option.

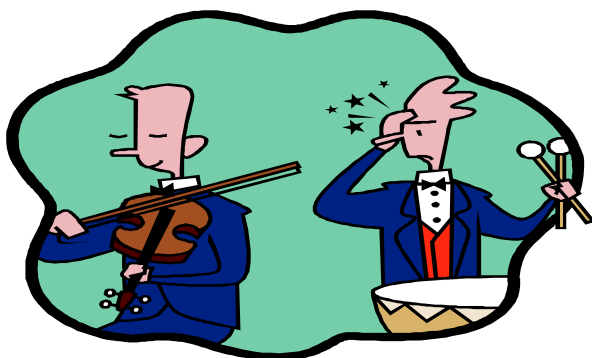
Wendy Ferrero advised that we have received our current gaming instalment and the next instalment is expected in November 2011.
