Guests: Dave Thompson introduced Gina (hard G) Dibden, Don Bonner spoke of the son he never had, exchange student Kevin, Ken Hammer reacquainted us with the recently returned Ray Penner of VIU, Mike Consell, our guest speaker was introduced by Kris Rongve and Christine Craigie advised that her partner John Layer would also take away our food donations. Rod Mont re-introduced the recently blistered Anna Owens, who has now presented her application for membership. (Got them from planting daffies!)

Never one to shirk the power, Sergeant-at-Arms Don Bonner managed to derange the order for our morning repast, and amazingly, the boys didn't eat last!

Kris returned to her feet, and formally presented our speaker, Mike Consell, the Executive-Director of Loaves & Fishes, our community food bank.

Mike shared their history, beginning 25 years ago with St. Paul's Anglican Church members providing assistance to some of their own needy. The numbers grew and they started to include members of the community. Within 13 years, the programme grew too big for the congregation, and they then incorporated the Loaves & Fishes Food Bank Foundation. (1996)

Since they opened their doors, the people of Nanaimo, through churches, businesses, service clubs and as individual donors and volunteers, have generously contributed time, energy, financial support, donations and vision to help feed those in need. In 2009, they provided 43,855 food bags to those in need. Mike noted that he had seen several of our Club members helping in past, and everyone is invited to come and see their them in action, and to volunteer.

Mike said his purpose, today, was also to promote "SHAW TV's Together is Amazing" campaign, where they, and Campbells Soup, will match every donation, pound for pound. (If you missed bringing something this morning, take your donation to to Christine & John's home before Tuesday, but first

Food distribution was initially located in Farquahar Street, near to their largest client base. Times have changed for the worse, and they added food distribution centres from Christ Community Church on Bowen Road, St. Andrews, Departure Bay Road, St. Paul's on Harewood Road, and Brechin United on Estevan Road.

Unfortunately, theirs is one of those businesses that keeps growing as a large segment of our population has the inability to meet their basic needs. "How many do we feed in a month?" as Mike. Answers were short. In fact, 3,500 to 4,000 adults per month, plus over 1,000 families. Their weekly food supplement bag provides one, to one and a half, days food. They also provide a hot meal to over 120 people per week. (THAT's nearly 5% of our city's population!)

One common problem is the lack of transport for those trying get

their meals. Their newest distribution centre will be located in Cedar. This is considered a win-win situation as clients will be closer to the food, and L&F will also find a newer volunteer and donation base.

The L&F annual budget is \$820,000, and cash is used to supplement their donations with perishable foods.

This year, the Christmas Hamper programmes will, again, be a joint effort between themselves and the Salvation Army. School District # 68 has donated the use of Mount Benson School, which is a great location to prepare their 2,000 plus food hampers: no stairs, and on a bus route. With \$20,000 from the Salvation Army, and over 300 volunteers, they assemble the hampers over a six week period. Nelson Allen said the Facilities committee at SD68 will continue their "donation" as the long term goal is to re-open that school for kindergarten. Mike admitted during questions that "It is a band-aid solution" and many of their population are the working poor. BC's minimum wage, once the highest, has not gone up since 2001, and is now the lowest. (Consider that our cost of living is one of the highest.) Leftover food from consumers can't be given out, because of public health issues, but they are investigating food from restaurants. Food donations should be non-perishable, and low risk perishables, such as garden fresh or store bought fruit and vegetables. Toilet paper, tooth paste and other personal care items and baby products are always valued. If you donate large bags of rice, potatoes, etc, they actually break them down. Lastly, they will even accept hotel 'travel kits.'



How come? Jennifer Tonsi came up with Kris? Kris announced the book to be donated in Mike's name was "Blue Day Book," a book of humour for these tough times, Jennifer presented the book, and Donna Allen snapped the photo. (GOT IT!! Camera shy Kris tried to negotiate herself out of the picture.)

Last Saturday's daffodil planting was in the shape of two Rotary Wheels, said Christine. She thanked the volunteers and Daryl Stech & Sharecost for the loan of the tools. Continuing, Christine asked that we dig deeper for donations to the Grey Cup Silent Auction. Rod stated we had sold all the of the Grey Cup 50/50 tickets. Jim McIvor passed out the posters for our Event, and they look great. (Check out our website)
