Meeting Notes - February 23rd

The Special Meeting of the five Nanaimo Rotary Clubs began with people mixing and mingling throughout the Legion Branch 256. Guests were greeted, hands shook, Rotarians visited Rotarians and guests alike.

The meeting was called to order at 6:10 by Curt Duddy of the Oceanside Club. He graciously filled in at the last moment as the official master of ceremonies.

Curt introduced our District Governor David Stocks and, as of July 2012, our newest Assistant District Governor, Barry Sparkes of the Lantzville Club.

Mr. Duddy spoke to the Five Core Values of Rotary –

- 1) Service
- 2) Good Fellowship
- 3) Diversity
- 4) Integrity
- 5) Leadership

The meeting was then turned over to Patrick Maguire, Past President of the Daybreak Club. He introduced a very special guest - Paul Harris - whom he commenced to interview. Paul Harris was played by Don Bonner of the Daybreak Club. He was dressed very much like a 1960's hippie, complete with psychedelic clothes, long colourful hair and peace signs.

PM - Mr Harris...you don't look much like your pictures.

PH -That is because I want to reach out to today's youth and embrace youth as the future leaders of our country.

PM - How did Rotary come about?

The interview continued along this line for a bit and at the end, Paul Harris had a few words for all Rotarians.

The mike was handed back to Mr. Duddy who then introduced Dave Hammond, President of the Rotary Club of Nanaimo.

Mr. Hammond noted that he had missed the memo on wearing a shirt and tie and had on instead a micro-credit shirt that was perfect because he was introducing International Service. He spoke of some of the projects that the Five Clubs of Area have done in places like Sunyani, Ghana, Africa.

Then, Bob Moss, President of Rotary North was introduced. He stated that he felt overdressed after seeing the outfit Paul Harris was attired in. Mr. Moss then spoke to the avenue of Youth Service. He reminded the audience of the following:

Bill Brendan, President of the Daybreak Club was next. He talked to us of Community Service. The Rotary Clubs of Nanaimo do a tremendous amount of service for the community. Bill noted there have been 150 major events completed by Rotarians, from golf tournaments to dances, and everything in between. The goal of the PR group of the Five Clubs is to remind everyone that the end of polio is this close....



Next to speak was Sucha Ollek, President of the Lantzville Club. He continued on with information regarding the eradication of polio. Rotary has raised 1.2 billion for this global initiative since 1988. There are 3 countries left that have polio and the end is in sight.
