After the war, many women continued to work and add greater financial support for their families.

Rotary was slower. In 1950, The India Council on Legislation proposed, unsuccessfully to delete "male" as a condition of membership. It took a U.S. Supreme Court ruling in 1987 to get those "bald headed, pot bellied, old male smokers"(my quote) to accept women within Rotary! To date, about 24% of all North American Rotarians are now women, and our Daybreak has 40%. (We were chartered with a similar percentage. Who else remembers 12 years back, when two of our members delivered babies? Who were they?)

Eileen said her father rode a Harley, as a message dispatcher during WWII, and was wounded twice. "Once by Germans, and once by Americans!" Her mother

Brian McFadden took the floor and explained that the Vancouver Island Military Museum's Mission is to collect, preserve and display the history of our Canadian Military Men & Women: "Lest we Forget." Their role is to be a reminder of the sacrifices made by Canada's men and women in the conflicts throughout our world. <http://www.vimms.ca/>

The non-profit Society was founded in 1986 and is a member of the British Columbia Museums Association and Organization of Military Museums of Canada. They closed their North Town Centre site in December past and will open their new site in the Centennial Building, in Pioneer Park, downtown, by September 2012.

Roger Bird explained they have expanded by over 50%, and their display area is now over 6,000 square feet. The artists rendition showed a maze, with guests entering one door, and leaving by another. Being the senior service, the Navy is the first display to be shown. Following thru, will be an Army display, and the junior Air Force will be next. The expanded area allows for displaying of WWII artifacts, the Korean & Afghanistan deployments, the Pacific Coast Rangers, and Women in the Canadian Forces. Air Aces Commodore Collishaw and Major Joseph Fell will also be presented.

Their refurbished Museum will include RCMP's role, Peace Keepers and our Canadian recipients of the highest military honour, the Victoria Cross.

They acquired the majority of their memorabilia from families concerned their parents legacy would be lost. The Museum's role is to keep those memories alive.

The cost: The total project to refurbish artifacts and to construct the interior is \$90,000. As Rotary's constitution includes world peace, our support makes sense. Brian asked that each Rotary Club donate \$4,000 to have the peacekeeping display dedicated to Rotary.

Youth Programmes are an important part of their role, with topics covering Founding of a Nation, Memories Project, Preserving Peace, Youth Volunteers and Special Needs education being presented in the Museum and within the schools.

Their new space created an opportunity for community groups to hold meetings in their media room, maybe to share wine and cheese, and have special access to the displays. Great stuff, Brian & Roger!
