Meeting Notes - October 10th

A couple of happy greeters met us at the door. Thanks, Daryl and Brian!...

Our day started with Karin Mattern at the door for signing in and with welcoming hands from Daryl Knievel and Brian Kirkhope. President Denise Larson started the meeting and our weekly rhythm was accompanied by Rod Mont's trumpet for O Canada.

Our guests for the day were Bill Saffin, a software consultant and Trish Rush from Rod's office. Sher Holubowich did a wonderful Rotary minute but was upset for being called the wrong name by the President. Nevertheless, she stressed that she was very proud to be a Rotarian and to provide the basic needs to those in need.

Don Bonner, sergeant-at-arms, allocated the tables for breakfast, but a few complained that he did not do exactly what he was supposed to do. Surely, it is a part of being sgt-at-arms.

Rod introduced our speaker Evelyn Mudryk. She talks to a radio programme weekly and works at Mosaic. Her topic for the day was "Cloud Computing 101". She started by saying that if you use iPhone, Samsung or internet, then probably you are already in the Cloud. She said she will explore how it affects business and

what is it exactly. The basic concept of Cloud Computing is that you would be able to access your data from any computer, anywhere in the world, through a web browser. You are not tied to your laptop or your office computer only. All the data will be stored in an outsourced location. You can develop software in demand and put it in cloud. It provides more flexibility and it is more secure than most people would think. The service models of Cloud Computing come in three models. It could be a cost savings project as there is no need to maintain an IT support team.

The cloud computing models are 1. SaaS 2. PaaS and 3. IaaS. SaaS stands for "Software as a Service". It is a distribution model. It makes it easier for tech personnel to troubleshoot from anywhere. The benefits include easier to admin, compatibility so everybody will have the same version, easy collaboration and accessibility. Cloud is making local network obsolete.

PaaS stands for "Platform as a Service". This model has made it easy for all the web developer to use the same platform for sharing the ideas and information.

IaaS stands for Infrastructure as a Service. This service provides a terminal server hosted by a third party in some other location. This has eliminated a need for having IT personnel. The benefits are security, low IT failure, and an optimized budget for a business. Cloud Computing is for a business of any size.

Bill Saffin also contributed by sharing his expertise on Cloud Computing. He gave an example of "share point" services for small business from Microsoft. You can share documents and even calendars with it. It is akin to Google Chrome which is in a different platform.

At the end of the talk, Rod presented a book which will be donated to a local library with the speakers' names on it.

It was announced that Oceanside Rotary will have George Anderson as a speaker at their next meeting. He will talk about Tsunami. Robb Mowbray made an announcement about a fundraising Gala evening for the NRGH Foundation for the new Emergency, happening on November 3rd





P.S. I would like to thank Emily of the Origins team for closing the kitchen door. Your action helped me to hear the speaker better.




