Rotary Minute Rod Mont

Rod advised that we have 100 Grey Cup Pool tickets to sell which amounts to 2.5 per club member. Rod also advised that today is World End Polio Day. In 1988 polio infected 350,000 children per year. In 2012 this number has dropped to 150. Rotary has been a key player in the near eradication of Polio and there is currently a big push by Rotary to finish the job. Rotary International has set a goal of raising \$25 million to fund the final eradication of Polio. Coupled with the matching contributions of the Bill and Melissa Gates Foundation and the federal government every dollar raised by Rotary gets tripled with matching grants.

Guest Speaker - Judy Byron District Governor

Judy advised that she was introduced to Rotary in 1988, when she was an outgoing Group Study Exchange member to India sponsored by our District. Judy joined the Sidney Rotary Club in May/88. In 2002, Judy was a team leader of a GSE team that travelled to Russia. Over the years, Judy has been very active at the District level culminating with her appointment as District Governor for fiscal 2012-2013. Judy advised that she is only the second female District Governor in District 5020.

In November, Judy met with the President of Rotary International Sakuji Tanaka. The theme for Rotary this year is Peace through Service. Judy noted that peace not only refers to the absence of war, but also peace throughout our daily lives. This would include freedom of speech and a sense of happiness in both our families, as well as communities. Judy believes that this is a natural fit with Rotary as we work together to make our communities better places to live.

Judy moved to Northern Alberta with her spouse in 1969. Her spouse had graduated with a social work degree but was unable to find work in Vancouver. They always hoped to get back to the west-coast and, when their daughter was in grade ten, they bought a small acreage in Saanich. Upon her daughter's graduation from high school, the family moved to Saanich. Judy took a job as a correctional officer for two years and then became the program director for the facility. Judy just recently retired from this position.

Judy advised that the District's role is to support individual Rotarians and their clubs to achieve their goals. There is currently a leadership deficit in the District as six clubs have no pres-elect and many clubs have vacant positions on their board.

In order to assist the clubs the District has revamped the District website. There is a new events calendar which allows each club to post their events. There is a Project Database where community and International projects can be posted. This will allow individual clubs to, not only, partner on international projects, but also exchange information on previous projects. Judy advises that the District sends out news by social media including Facebook and Twitter. The District has a PR Committee to help clubs communicate to the community. In addition, there is a New Generation Chair to assist clubs on new projects. Judy views the District Board as a service provider to the clubs to motivate clubs in meeting their goals. In addition the District hopes to increase the awareness of Rotary to
