Rotarian and Salvation Army Envoy Dawne Anderson spoke on the 125th Anniversary of the Salvation Army in Nanaimo. On her mother's side, Dawne has five generations of history with the Church!

The SA began its work in Canada in 1882 and was modeled on England's William & Catherine Booth concept of providing "soup and salvation" to it congregation. Its demonstrated social benefits from it activities overcome opposition and the Salvation Army was entrenched in Canada when given legal Canadian status in 1909. To date the SA has 311 Corps (Churches) and more than 330 social-service institutions in Canada & Bermuda. In addition to church members and volunteers, the Corps employs over 10,000 people.

The Nanaimo Corps was founded in 1888 and their Church was built in 1893 at the Nicol Street site. In 1942, the annex was added and was later moved to the current Howard Street building.

In addition to 75,000 hot meals per year, the Nanaimo Corps provides emergency shelter, transitional housing, housing for parolees and refers people for treatment. During last Christmas, the SA delivered 2,700 food hampers. Whether you need a haircut, hot shower, laundry, legal advice, a sitter while you work or someone to listen to your troubles, the Nanaimo Corps is there to help. Dawne has been rewarded many times by clients saying "you have changed my life" when offered assistance through the Corps.

Early SA Officers (preachers) needed protection from protesters. Their bodyguards became bored and The Army Band was formed to give them something to occupy their time. To this day, Dawne is a "closet trumpeter who keeps blow-

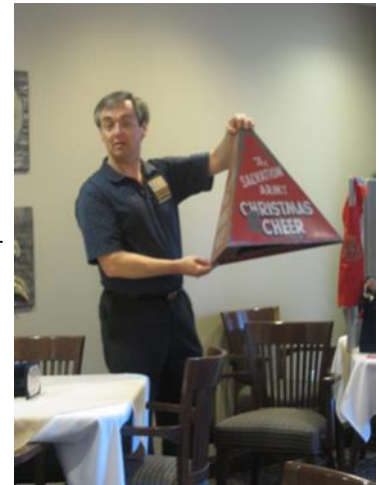
