Leanna's interest in optometry started when her father had an eye problem. Although he was reluctant to see an optometrist, they convinced him to go in on a Saturday.

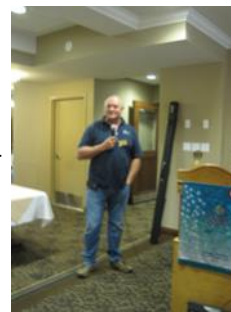

Their regular optometrist was away, so they went to another optometrist office and, after a two hour wait, they were able to get her father's eyes examined. Although the optometrist could not see a problem, she referred him to an ophthalmologist for a further exam that Monday. It was determined that he had a retinal tear and he had to take five weeks off after the surgery. Leanna was so impressed with the service provided by the optometrist, even giving her cell no. out, should there be any problems in the evening or weekend. Leanna took a job with the Optometrist answering phones and fitting glasses. She stayed there for a year and then joined a larger practice for three years, fitting both regular glasses as well as progressive lenses. Leanna developed a reputation as "the go-to girl" when the Dr's prescriptions were not working. She has gained experience at every level of the practice and learned very early that her goal was to keep eyes healthy.

Leanna obtained her Optometry degree from Pacific University in Oregon. It was a four year program and, in the fourth year, she had four three-month internships. The first internship was in Lexington, Kentucky. The second was back in Oregon. The third and most memorable was in Bethel, Alaska, which was used as a base to service several remote fishing villages. They would fly-in with their own equipment and, quite often, the temperature, with the wind chill, would drop to -50 c. On one trip they got caught in a blizzard and couldn't get out for 48 hours. They had no running water so they had to get creative on their latrine etiquette.

Leanna said that she made some lifelong friends in Alaska.

The last rotation was in Vancouver and, after completion, she and her husband decided they wanted to stay on the west coast. Leanna advised that, upon getting married, she went to Oregon to school and her husband went to UBC in Engineering and only recently have they been reunited.

Leanna ended up coming to Nanaimo when neighbours in Calgary decided they wanted to retire in Nanaimo. He is a Canada Post employee and was able to get transferred to Nanaimo. His wife found employment with Paul Geneau, a Rotarian and Optometrist and she advised Leanna that Paul was looking to hire a new Optometrist. Leanna applied and was successful in getting the position. Paul was then instrumental in finding an engineering position for her husband.

And Leanna really, really, really loves her job!!!!!!! We can thank Kris Rongve for introducing Leanna to our club.

Najeet and Cameron from the VIU Accounting program advised that they are looking to partner with Rotary and have invited our club to the 7th Annual Vancouver Island Leadership Conference to be held October 25-26, 2013 @ VIU. It features inspirational speakers, interactive workshops and social networking opportunities.
