

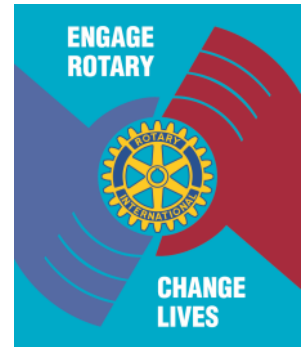

Meeting Notes - Nov. 20th

Nathan Thornton was double dipping this morning: as a Greeter and taking monies. Rod Mont began our proceedings with his horn. President Randall took the helm and quoted Margaret Mead "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed, citizens can change the world. Indeed, it is the only thing that ever has."

Don Bonner gave an Invocation and Anna Jones intro'd guests. Daryl Knievel presented Steve Dusenbury of Dusenbury Automotive on Wellington Road.

Jeff Boegel's Rotary Moment spoke on The Rotary Foundation (TRF) and its Annual Giving Programme. Basically, TRF receives donations and invests it for three years. Those donations are then distributed: 50% goes to the World Fund, which is distributed by Rotary International in the form of Global Grants. Every club in any district can apply for project funding.

The remaining balance is returned to the District's that originally donated the funds. For our District 5020, "District Grants" are distributed as

- a. District Community Grants (DCG)
 - DCGs may be used for local and international projects.
 - DCGs are intended for small projects and do not require an international partner, but still require active Rotarian involvement.
 - DCGs will match a club contribution dollar for dollar up to a grant size of US \$2,500.
- b. District Matching Grants (DMG)
 - DMGs are intended for international projects that do not qualify for Global Grants.
 - DMGs are international grants and require an international partner.
 - DMGs will match a club contribution 50 cents to the dollar up to a grant size of US \$10,000.

Another way that we compound the benefits of TRF donations is with nineteen Mid-Island Clubs banding together to carry out major projects.

How do we keep this cycle going? With your donations to TRF. The goal is that "Every Rotarian, Every Year" donates \$100. You get a charitable donation receipt, with every \$1,000 US you receive recognition as a Paul Harris Fellow" and our District and eventually or Club gains back those funds for donations within our local and international communities. Check out TRF. You will discover this organization is one of the lowest cost to run organizations in the world.

San Mahara explained "CODE." COMMUNITY DENTAL is primarily run by Dr Larry Hill. They provide emergency dental work to people those who can't afford the treatment costs. Our Club made two applications for District Community Grants for a Guatemala Dental Clinic and for CODE. Apparently District became confused and only Guate was approved. Our Club has still committed \$2,500 to CODE with the hope of being matched by District. That may still come. By the rules, if we give the money to CODE now, we will have to match another \$2,500 if District approves our application in December.

Notice of Motion by Anna Jones that we donate \$500 from our Gaming Account to CODE now. By the end of December, District 5020 will make their final funding decision. Only then will we distribute the committed \$2,500 and/or the additional \$2,500 from District to CODE. Donna Allen reminded us of Pot Luck for newlyweds Martin and Eileen at Donna's place at 5:30 on 30th of November. Let her know what.....
