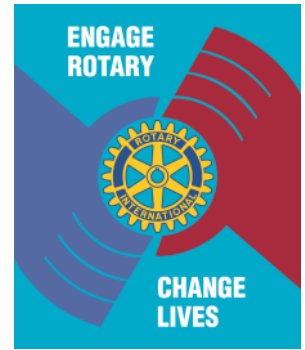

Rotary Minute

Graham Calder advised that the first design of the Rotary wheel was made by Chicago Rotarian Montague Bear, an engraver who drew a simple wagon wheel, with a few lines to show dust and motion. The wheel was said to illustrate "Civilization and Movement". In 1922 it was decided that all Rotary clubs adopt a single design as the exclusive emblem of Rotarians. In 1923 the present gear wheel, with 24 cogs and six spokes was adopted by Rotary International. A group of engineers advised that the geared wheel was mechanically unsound and would not work without a keyway in the center of the gear to attach it to a power shaft. So, in 1923 the keyway was added and the design which we now know was formally adopted as the official Rotary International emblem.

Club Assembly

Funds Allocation-Dave Thompson

Dave advised that they are looking for committee members. Last year Dave advised that they tried to have most discussions regarding fund requests by email but found that this was not especially effective in exchanging opinions on the worthiness of the applications. So moving forward Dave plans to have monthly meetings to discuss the various funding requests. Dave confirmed that the committee only has authority up to a \$500 limit, anything in excess must go to the club members. All requestors of merit are encouraged to attend our meeting and address the members. The committee responds to all requests, excluding blanket international, advising that we don't have available funds at this time. Dave advised that our budget this year for funds allocation is \$3,500. Dave also advised that the Groveland Park request for funds will probably be presented to the 5 club committee.

Don confirmed that the Boys & Girls Club located on Fifth Street by the railroad tracks is being power washed this weekend to prepare the building for painting the following weekend. Dulux Paints has donated the paint and several painters for the project but Don is looking for more Rotarians to partner with the Young Professionals to assist in completion of the project. Don will distribute a signup sheet next week looking for volunteers.

Don also advised that the District Governor will be attending our club meeting next week.

Joy Cameron advised the meeting that they are looking for a family to host an inbound student from Holland for the period of August through December. The student is seventeen years old and will be attending Dover high school. The host family receives a small monthly stipend of \$250 to help defray additional costs.

Luca told the club that upon his return to France, after his exchange two years ago, he graduated from high school and was admitted to medical school. Luca advises that he has kept in contact with many of the exchange students most of which apparently are female.

A boisterous rendition of Happy Birthday was sung to Bill Brenden, Robb Mowbray and Eileen Tatton(in abstentia)

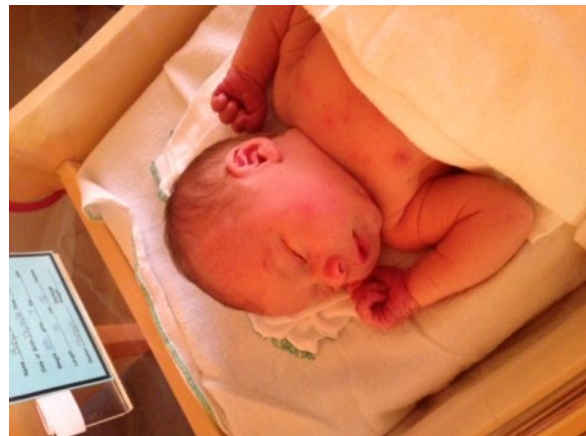
50/50 Draw
