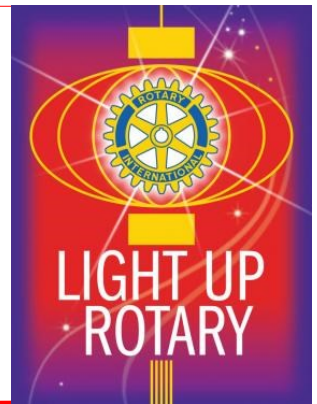

Rotarians and Guests – today we welcomed guests Mike Garvie, guest of Graham and John Kirkhope son of Brian. Visiting Rotarians included Michael Procter, District Governor and Barry Sparkes, Asst Governor.

Karin provided a Rotary Minute – sharing her thoughts about the collective energy of the 5 clubs in Nanaimo. She mentioned the Nepal Vigil, the District conference, the 5-Club synergy, and all the great things that happen as a result. She encourage all Rotarians to sign up for the conference.

Michael Procter spoke of changes to the Rotary grants. Highlighted was the exceptional reputation the Rotary Foundation has with fund disbursement (92% spent on projects). He also spoke of the importance of membership. Hemmentioned the growth in other areas of the world and how locally we need to ensure we are communicating the work of Rotary to our community to attract new members. He also spoke of the up-coming conference as a great way to promote Rotary.

Jeff took the opportunity to recognize Neil for his great work on the golf tourney, Patrick for a successful shredding event, and then promoted the next event, which is the poker event on June 13th. There is a need for ticket sales. Jeff also mentioned an open house party invite at his place for the weekend.

Neil gave a wrap-up to the golf, stating somewhere close to \$14,000 was raised. He also mentioned he is looking for leadership in taking over the golf as he heads towards more responsibilities in Rotary. He also mentioned the Rotary Nine-and-Dine he is working on for August. More details to come.
