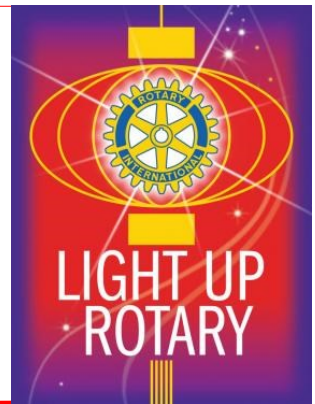

San Mahara updated about "Westwood Lake Walk and Mt. Benson Hike for Nepal" happening on September 26th. The details will follow.

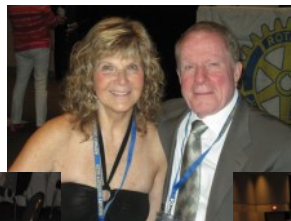
Rod Mont asked members to fill up a ballot to select a "Rotarian of the year".
