Ron advised that our club has been collecting books for Literacy Nanaimo for 18 years. We originally used mail boxes but have since built book boxes that are not only more functional but also more attractive. Currently about 20 percent of the club is actively involved in emptying the book boxes and delivering the books to the retail location of Literacy Nanaimo every week. We currently have a book box in Woodgrove and Country Club as well as at the Country Grocer on Bowen. Our efforts generate about \$40,000 in revenue for Literacy Nanaimo. These dollars are used to fund their various programs.

Peggy has been involved for many years in various volunteer organizations such as the children's clothes exchange as well as the Harewood Neighbourhood Association and Harewood Community Center Co-operative. The Harewood Neighbourhood Association is community drive society whose mandate is to enhance the quality of life and the environment of Harewood. This includes working with schools, businesses and all levels of government in the delivery of community

services and projects. Peggy is very active in organizing events designed to foster pride in the rich heritage of Harewood.

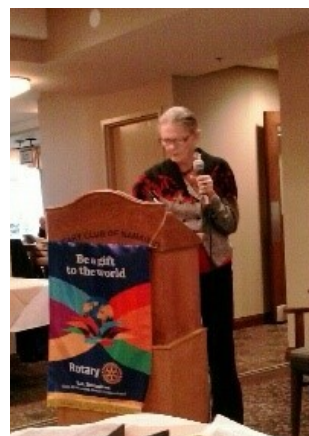
Peggy has two grown children.

Peggy joined us today to tell us about the Harewood Centennial Park located beside John Barsby Community School which is currently being expanded. The park currently has a water park, playground, sports fields and a lacrosse box and they have plans to build a skate park, new bike trails and a covered multi-purpose court. In addition, they hope to rebuild the lacrosse box.

The first project is the Skate Park which is currently in the design phase. Peggy advised that there are no other such facilities in Harewood and young people skateboard on the street and at malls which is not very safe. The skate park will be completed in phases and on completion will cover an area of 12,000 square feet. The final cost will be \$300,000 and to date \$141,000 has been raised. Peggy will provide a formal funding request to our club.
