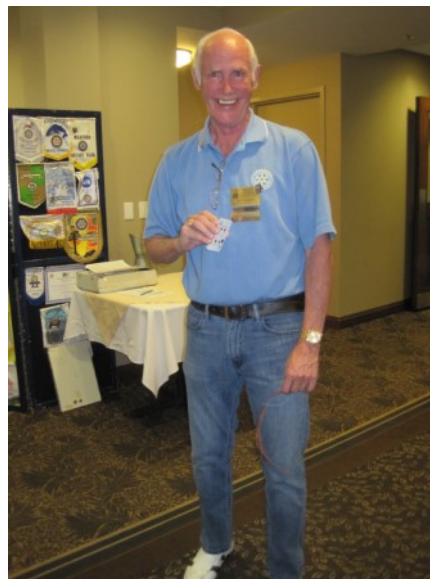

President Eileen started the meeting at 7:00 sharp. She led the introductions, which included visiting fellow Rotarian Bob Fenty from the Rotary Club of Nanaimo and Henry Traa, who has moved from Winnipeg and is looking for a new Rotary home here in Nanaimo. Guests included Bonnie Murrell, who works at the Childhood Development Centre in Nanaimo and was a GSE team member in 2004. Also Sam Muir, our outbound student was in attendance. (Sam's faithful attendance at our meetings was noted by Donna Allen). Daryl Knievel assigned table order and breakfast began.

Don Bonner provided a Rotary minute with a focus on community members who "don't know they are Rotarians yet". A particular example is a community effort formed by Bill Robinson (well known to most of our members), which follows the Pay It Forward example. Members put money into a monthly "pot", which then falls to one of the members to use for a community benefit. This has included such projects as supporting Nanaimo Youth Services with money to repair musical instruments.

The presentation this morning was a focus on the Rotary Foundation, provided by our own Nelson Allen. Nelson reminded us all that the Rotary Foundation provides the basis for the funding received when we apply for community and World Service grants. The funds in the Rotary Foundation are a voluntary donation, which can be made in several ways through our club or privately to the Foundation. There was significant information provided, and discussed, about the use of Paul Harris points. These Points are earned through donations to the Foundation and can be "given" to others to be used to earn a Paul Harris Fellowship. Paul Harris points accumulate after your first Paul Harris fellowship is received. An example of the use of Paul Harris points will be the use of points to provide Paul Harris fellowships to the three local doctors who assisted our visiting Rotarian friend Senyo.

It was mentioned that the club, at one time, would top-up points to offset the cost of exchange rate between USA dollars and Canadian dollars. Rotarians can check their own past donations and points on the Rotary International website. It was noted that our club has strong support of the Foundation with 24 of our current 40 members being Paul Harris Fellows.

Bob Fenty announced that there is a need for more host families to support our in-bound youth exchange student next year. We will be supporting a student from Norway and another from Thailand. Four host families are required at this time. Host families receive \$350.00 per month to offset expenses. Please contact Bob Fenty or Paul Geneau for more information.

Neil Sorsdahl described the success of our club golf tournament, raising about \$12,500.00. The winning team included our own Daryl Knievel and, thankfully, the Daybroke Rotary Golf trophy went to members of the Lantzville Rotary Club.

Dawne Anderson let us know that we are just three weeks away from the Salvation Army golf tournament. Call Dawne for details and to participate.

Ken Hammer detailed the appreciation dinner for the medical team who assisted Senyo while he was in Nanaimo. Dinner will be at Rewsters, June 11. There are only 45 tickets available. Paul Harris Fellowships will be awarded, from points provided by Nanaimo area Rotary Clubs.

Our 50/50 draw saw Neil Sorsdahl pick the winning card and capture a prize of \$1,199.00. The prize is going where it was well-earned after all the work Neil has done to make the golf tourney a success yet again.

Ev Boegh was the winner of the Foundation draw, and with that, we recited the Four Way Test and said our goodbyes.
