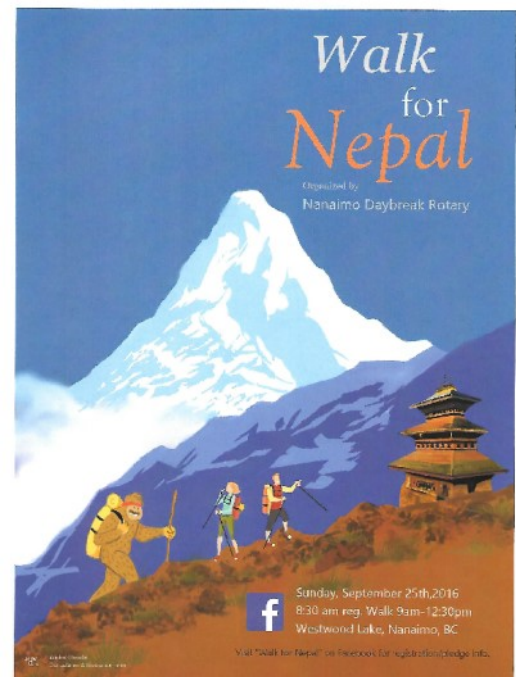

Volunteers must be vetted (including criminal record check) if they have "continued contact" with youth. This was defined as 72 hours of continuous contact with youth. "Casual contact" was defined as "not directly responsible for youth, incidental contact". The YPO provides the District with our club compliance forms and annual training for all club members.

There are guides and forms for screening volunteers found at Clubrunner.ca as well as several links to Youth Protection policy and guidelines. The suggestion was made to link all YPO resources to our website.

Announced that next week (September 14), the District Governor will be attending our meeting.
