But, hey! The Clippers history spans 45 years in Nanaimo and many did not want them to move. Hence, a Society was born to buy the team. The owners cooperated and will let the team stay in Nanaimo for one more year. Thanks to efforts by Clippers staff, the community members and major business contributors, the society hopes to raise the necessary \$1million funds within a year.



This team contributes valuable community engagement with team members volunteering in schools, hockey training and fundraising with the Salvation Army and others. The team has two past members currently playing in the NHL and have had 36 players overall in the big leagues. The Clippers members also get education opportunities to play hockey and with fully funded scholarships at many American Universities.
