The meeting opened with the members singing 'O Canada' followed by an invocation.

Guests attending this morning were Cheryl Leukefeld, who would be the guest speaker for this meeting, Michael Furlot, from the Ladysmith Rotary club and Bev Hilton, Assistant District Governor. Our Sergeant at Arms assigned table order and breakfast began.



Announcements: Nathan asked for member's suggestions for a "President's Project" for the upcoming year. Also, Nathan asked for a volunteer to be the Fellowship Chair, Shar H. offered and was enthusiastically endorsed by club members.

Terry Rogers provided a **Rotary Moment**. His theme of "make Youth Exchange great again" began with his neck tie being worn fashionably long, as is the custom of the President of another, foreign club. Terry announced that Youth Exchange, for this coming year, will have an increase in both in-coming and out-going students. Host families are required to make this experience great for the students. Bev Hilton presented the club with a certificate recognizing the clubs work in support of "End Polio Now". The certificate was for our work during the 2015/ 16 Rotary year.

Guest Speaker:

Bev then introduced our speaker; Cheryl Leukefeld.

Cheryl is the Canadian co-coordinator for The World's Greatest Meal, a project to raise funds for the eradication of Polio. The project was started four years ago by Suzanne Rea. Its purpose is encouraging Rotary Clubs to plan a club or community meal (or virtual meal), which will raise funds in support of the cause. Suzanne, now 74 years old, has spent over \$200,000.00 in travelling around the world to encourage this program. Her travels had Suzanne working in Africa for six months of last year. In return for her efforts, the program has raise over \$2.5 million dollars, which will find matching grants to generate over \$7.5 million to fight Polio.

Cheryl provided an update on eradication efforts, stating that strain III has been eradicated with only strain I and II left to fight. So far this year there have been only five known cases of Polio on the planet. The biggest threat to eradication is human migration. She encouraged us, and other clubs, to "do what you can, don't give up the fight". (Website is wgmeal.com, for additional information)

Other announcements:
