Youth Protection Presentation

Graham directed us to the website <https://portal.clubrunner.ca/50092/sitepage/youth-protection-information> for the district's policy and procedures for youth protection and the Abuse and Harassment Prevention Training Manual and Leader's Guide. The protection policy applies to all activities that involve minors. Although not exhaustive these would include Youth Exchange, Ryla, Rotaract and Interact. Graham advised that each club must have a Youth Protection Officer and needs to schedule a Youth Protection presentation every Rotary year.

All volunteers directly involved with Youth services needs to be vetted, which includes obtaining a criminal record check.

Graham advised there is strict reporting requirements of any alleged abuse of a minor involved with Rotary. The Youth Protection Officer should be advised immediately and if the abuse is of a sexual nature the proper authorities should be immediately advised as well. The safety of the alleged victim is paramount. All details of the incident should be properly documented. In discussion, it was decided that the board will formulate policy relating to youth safety for our club.
