***Our Prayers go out to our own Denise Larson! Her husband Rick is Missing!!!...***

Police in Nanaimo are asking for help finding an elderly man who walked away from his home and hasn't been seen since.

Nanaimo RCMP said Rick Larson, 72, hasn't been seen since the morning of Thursday, Oct. 25. He was last seen in the area of Petroglyph Provincial Park, between the Trans Canada Hwy. and Haliburton St. in the city's south end.

Police said it is very unusual for Larson not to return home.

He is clean shaven, 6'2" and about 230 pounds. Larson is believed to be wearing a black hat, black backpack and blue jeans.

An online post noted the presence of Nanaimo Search and Rescue and Mounties in the area of the Chase River Estuary on Thursday evening, but police have not confirmed if it's related to Larson's disappearance.
