Christine Craigie intro's guests: Rahul Ramteke, Michael Holyk, Andrea Paris and our Assitant Governor Wayne Anderson from Nanaimo Rotary,

Ev showed some videos captured from Rotary International showing the impact of Rotary's various programmes including Water Health, Polio from 350,000 cases in 1988 with only four last year. "Zero Matters" as polio is only a plane ride away.

Foundation Director Nelson Allen "I'll be brief" and then he explained what Paul Harris Foundation and it's various awards mean. To demonstrate the breadth of where Foundation money goes, he asked how many of us had volunteered in various countries. Most stood. Later, Ron, Graham Patrick later spoke their impact from Guatemala, San Mahara, Ken Hammer & Graham Calder spoke on their impact from Nepal, (San & family was there during the Nepal Earthquake.) He realized he could focus efforts to support kids. Ken will later speak on the Nepal Trek to base camp on Mount Everest and intense life experience. Graham, Vickie & Doug Pearson coordinated the four District 5020 Clubs fundraising. Ken lastly spoke of Ghana as an humbling experience when he realized his family became more of collectivists versus an individual.

Paul Harris Fellow (PHF) scrolls and pins were awarded to Sher Hulobowich, Daryl Knievel. Sheila Forrest PH +1, Charter Member Ev Boegh PH +1, Rod Fay PH +2, Doug Pearson PH +3, Ken Hammer gave a PH to his partner Brenda and Don Bonner PH +10.

Area 4 Assistant Governor Wayne Anderson congratulated the PHF recipients and complimented us as our club has the people to initiate projects and we all seem to help. As Evelyn assumed our President's role nearly six months ahead if her expected 2018-2019 year, (unforced move of President Nathan) she accepted a 2017-18 Rotary Presidential Citation awarded to Daybreak for achieving goals related to increased membership, sustainable service projects, Foundation giving and promoting awareness of Rotary.
