These are exciting times for Nanaimo Collishaw Airport. They recently approved a 20 year \$20 million development plan for expansion of the terminal. The current project fulfills critical priorities of regional economic development, economic stimulus through construction and



meeting increased demand for air service. This phase of the terminal; expansion will cost \$6 million, adds 14,000 sq. ft. for additional comfort and convenience for travellers with completion in 2020. By utilizing a modular design, future terminal expansions will be completed when warranted and funded.

With easy access to Central VI and flight destinations now including Toronto and Calgary, they continue to break records and handled over 430,000 passengers in the past year. Check out their site <https://www.nanaimoairport.com/>
