President Ev Boegh opened the meeting with 'O Canada' accompanied by Rod Mont.

Our Guests this morning were Rabi Salih and Patrick McIntosh. Patrick is the Urban Forestry Coordinator for the City of Nanaimo.

Announcements:

The Rotary Book Sale starts April 5th. There will be a Rotary information table at the sale, which requires volunteers. If you can spare an hour or two, please contact President Ev.

Seven of our club members have confirmed their attendance at the District Training Assembly (conference) in May.

Ev reminded us of the Bolivia projects event this coming Thursday (April 11th) at the Rotary Field House.

The committee for the upcoming Silly Boat festival is Doug Lum, Cemi Vur, Ed Whittenberg and Dominic Whittenberg. This is a 5-club initiative.

Rabi Salih was introduced. She is a Ghanaian/ Canadian teacher who has resided in Canada for 14 years. Rabi will be attending the global conference, "Women Deliver". The conference has a focus on health and education. Rabi has asked our club for support for her attendance.



Patrick Maguire let us know of the club's support for victims of Cyclone Idai, which caused catastrophic damage to Mozambique, Malawi and Zimbabwe. Our support provided five water treatment systems, which will produce the equivalent of five million gallons of drinkable water.

Presentation: Our speaker for this morning was **Patrick McIntosh**. Patrick is a red-seal horticulturalist, master organic gardener. He is the City of Nanaimo arborist and Urban Forestry Coordinator.



The urban forest includes both planted and naturally occurring trees, and their relationship with people and development. Patrick described the extensive benefits we gain from the urban forest. In addition to the environmental benefits, which are often discussed, Patrick showed the social and economic benefits from the urban forest.

There is concern that most urban natural environments are in decline. Nanaimo's Urban Forest Management Strategy was developed in 2010. This included a bylaw to retain trees and a focus to expand the tree canopy in the City. Currently, the City is working through a tree inventory. However, it appears that there has been a loss of tree canopy since the Urban Forest Management Strategy was implemented. This is bringing further changes to the management plan and bylaws.
