Satellite Club?... Most Rotarians are aware that Rotary's membership numbers have been relatively stagnant for some time now. We have been at 1.2 Million members for more than 10 years with about as many Rotarians leaving Rotary as are joining. Of the 170,000 members that left Rotary last year 31% felt that Rotary was too expensive or took too much time, 21% were unhappy with the club environment and 15% had unmet expectations. This suggest that there is a large portion of the population that is interested in Rotary, but want to experience it in a different way than is currently offered. Now we can definitely work to make our club experiences more inclusive and welcoming, but perhaps another approach is needed in areas where the current club options still don't reflect all of the communities needs. This is where a Satellite Club can help us provide the opportunity for Rotary to many more people.

By creating a satellite, a club allows members to meet at a different time and place from the rest of the club. Like all Rotary clubs, satellite clubs hold regular meetings, have bylaws and a board, and get involved in community service projects. A local Rotary club sponsors the club and provides advice and support. Satellite club members are Rotarians. Officially, they are members of the sponsor club. Some clubs have used the Satellite Club model to expand their club in ways that didn't seem possible. Starting a satellite club offers the additional benefits of expanding project possibilities, visibility, and the impact of Rotary in your community. It also develops more leaders in your community and the Rotary district.

Many clubs feel that there aren't anymore potential Rotarians in their community. They often say that they've asked everyone they can and their club is perfect just the way it is. The reality is that less than 2% of the eligible adults in District 5020 are members of a Rotary club. Our District gets leads every month of potential Rotarians that can't find a club that meets their schedule or lifestyle. More Satellite Clubs means more options and more Rotarians making a difference in our communities and the world.
