Meantime, Rod was seen busy passing out ballots to nominate the Rotarian of the Year.

The Rotary minute was given by Sher Holubowich. She outlined all the fundraising events we do at the club for the community in which we live. She sees friendship and fellowship with people making a difference. She thinks it was not Rotary that made her change, but the members of the club who inspired her to change. Well said Sher!

Patrick Maguire mentioned the Shredding event that happened last week. The job was more of guality than quality this time, as few people came by, but generated more funds, which will be used for the Polio Plus programme. The featured speaker was Dr. John Snively, a dentist who does voluntary work in Guatemala for Mayan people. He had carried out a Rotary dental project in 2013 at Lake Atitlan in Guatemala. He shared some of his inside story as to how he got involved with Rotary and doing this community service for needy people. At the same time, while at community service, he had developed a close friendship with Ron.

He graduated in 1971 from the University of Toronto. At 27, he retired and went traveling. He went to Guatemala and instantly fell in love. After, he came back to Canada and landed a modest job as a dentist. He continued going back to Guatemala. Later, he ran his own dental practice with an holistic biological approach for 15 years. He sold his practice, took his second retirement and moved to Victoria. He loved Victoria so much so that he settled there and started dental practice once again.

Finally he retired for the third time and took on an opportunity to go to Guatemala for a dental project. As a dentist, he saw terrible oral infection in kids and adults alike. The dental infection was so severe that it lead to Osteomyelitis, infection of a bone. He believes dental infection which leads to Osteomyelitis is one of the leading causes of death. local Rotary club, he brought back a dental project.

The village that he goes to is situated beside a lake on the foothill of a mountain and is very vulnerable to landslide. He did dental work in a couple of places around Lake Atitlan. He did lot of dental surgery, fillings, cleaning and, most importantly, educating the people about the importance of healthy eating and oral hygiene. The most scarey part was doing dental surgery without the benefits of x- ray.

The dental equipment was donated through the Rotary club. He mentioned that there was a need for more help and more funding. Donations can be made to the Innovative Community Foundation.

During the Q/A period, he mentioned that poor diet consisting of refined sugary food is the main culprit for dental infection. Even small kids are seen with big bottles of soda, gulping all the time. In the community there are more affluent groups of people, too, but the problem here is mainly with Mayan origin due to low socio economic condition.

Patrick reiterated that \$10,000 worth of projects are being planned to build latrines and to install x-ray equipment, with the help of multiple sources and matching grants.

Rod Mont thanked Dr. John for the insightful talk.

There was no winner of the 50/50. The Sergeant took lots of happy bucks and quite a few fines from whiners.

All the Interact members had a photo-op session with their T- shirts promoting the club.

Finally we said a toast to Rotary and the meeting was done.
