Meeting Notes - August 28th

Rod Mont led the club in O Canada on his trusty saxophone.

Bob Wall stepped in for Wendy Ferraro on Invocation and indicated his gratitude for the much needed rain, but also expressed his desire for a return to summer.

Ron Fisher from Campbell River a Rotary Youth Protection Officer

Terry Rogers advised of the impact that Rotary and Rotarians have in our communities. His firm had organized a team building event at the zip lines at Wildplay, south of Nanaimo. As it turned out only about one third of his staff were able to complete the four levels, indicating that the majority of his staff were not very physically active. In discussion with Ev Mudryk, she expressed her passion and success for the walking program she had organized. Terry and his spouse joined Ev's group and proudly carry their pedometers. Terry's company has now set up their own walking program with 26 participants. Terry then thanked Ev for introducing him and now his firm to the pedometer walking program.

Bill Brenden advised that he is going to a five club meeting tonite to discuss the Youth Exchange program. Bill was looking for club support for the program. Daryl Knievel advised that he is hosting Sarah December through March of this Rotary year. Discussion ensued as to whether the Nanaimo clubs can host more than one exchange student. Ken hammer advised the meeting that in the past there was the plan for each club to host one exchange student. This never happened. Ken suggested that we should advise that our club supports additional exchange students from the current level of one and we will make it happen.

Speaker Ron Fisher

Ron advised that he is a Past President of the Campbell River Rotary Club. He is currently the Youth Protection Officer in our District. He works predominantly with the Rotary Youth Exchange program, which he advised is the largest student exchange program in the world. The program is not only rewarding for the students, but also for the host families and the clubs.

When Ron was in Venezuela and Columbia on a wheel chair project, he was welcomed by many former exchange students. He believes that the student exchange program has a greater impact in other countries.

Hosting a student by a smaller club can be a significant commitment, as the club normally requires three host families per year. The club also provides a stipend to the host families to defray some the costs of hosting. Fortunately, the school districts do not charge for the student to attend school, as there is an outbound student that provides space for the international student.

Usually, once the outbound student has been determined, Ron believes they should start attending Rotary meetings. This can result in the student attending 10 to 15 meetings before they leave.

The inbound students are canvassed upon arrival to determine their interests and hoped-for activities during their stay. The students are then set up with families who can assist with this regard. Every family has its own particular culture which provides variety for the in-...continued on next page/ bound students.

Several years ago, Rotary International put in place a screening process to ensure youth involved with Rotary were not put at risk. It was prudent in view of problems incurred in other organizations, such as the Scouts in the U.S. Policies were developed to ensure the safety of the students, as well as the Rotary Clubs. All Rotarians in regular contact with students should have a Criminal Record Check. Any families hosting Youth Exchange students must also first complete a checklist and affidavit and meet with the Youth Protection officer at their residence to ensure a safe environment for the student. Ron advised that they have tried to parallel the checks with those in the states and the protocol matches that of the school district.

Ron also advised that it is the decision of each club as to whether Rotarians in casual contact with youth should have a Criminal Record Check. Not-for-profit organizations can get grants to cover the cost of the checks.

Kris Rongve advised of the rotary BBQ scheduled for 4pm Saturday Sept 7th @ the Rogers located at 3730 Polaris Drive (rain or shine). A sign up list was passed around. BYOB, lounge chair and warm clothing.

Randall advised of the 5pm creative fundraising think session @ Mosaic tonight. Ev indicated there might even be some snacks there. Randall also advised that we have committed \$2500 to dental projects in both Guatemala and locally with CODE.
