

With Don Bonner at the font, Rod Mont's horn began our morning



She has been E.D. of Disaster Aid Canada for the past five months. Born & raised in Victoria, two children, has the travel bug and is involved with indigenous schools near her Mexican home. Anne noted that Disaster Aid Canada and Shelter Box do similar work in responding to disasters by supplying family survival packs. The major difference is Shelter Box money and manufacturing is sent to England. Disaster Aid Canada is cheaper and Canadian.

The Survival Kit Boxes are blue and yellow to reflect our Rotary heritage. A typical Kit contains:

A UN & SPHERE compliant dome tent Quality tools Multi fuel stove Dishes, pots, pans, utensils Innovative waterproof multi-purpose blankets/ponchos Mosquito nets Repair kit Water purification tablets Sawyer water filter Water containers **Blankets** Nylon rope

The cost \$750 Cdn. Packs can be customized: No blankets to hot countries, substitute more tools.

Anne then drank a glass of water that came from the water filter kit. She explained the water came from a dirty ditch outside the Qualicum Bay Club. Rod showed the Sawyer Water Filter with the water Cost \$100. The gravity kit can purify up to 1 million gallons.

Wherever needed, the Survival Packs are shipped in containers and costs about \$4,000. Kits are always ready whenever needed.

Patrick Maguire was thanked and he spoke on "Soap for Hope." With help from Sher Hulobowich, Christine Craigie, John Layer, Donna & Nelson Allen, they divert used soaps, shampoos and conditioners from local hotel/motels and ship it to Anne. The soap is melted and made into bars and the shampoos and conditioners are repackaged into one and five litre containers. Anne shared that October 15 is Global Handwashing Day http://globalhandwashing.org/ghw-day

Many diarrheal and acute respiratory diseases are prevented by simple handwashing. Anne says the indigenous Mexicans live below the poverty level, often work in the fields in the morning. As they often live in the fields, they would then go to school without cleaning up. The soap kits also contain much needed washcloths.

There's more! Her mailbox always feels like Christmas. She frequently receives "Little Dresses for Africa" packages with local's sewing pillowcases into dresses for children. Menstruation is stigmatized in many countries and causes women to stay away from school. Anne has others making packages of six re-usable sani-pads and "Days for Girls" packages.

Patrick presented Anne with a cheque for one Disaster Aid Kit

Our 50/50 has accumulated \$334 says Patrick and the absent Bill Brendon's number was drawn. Sher missed the five of spades. Bill again snagged the right tix and won 10 freebies for next week's draw.

Sgt-at-Arms Daryl is such a softie and collected Happy Bucks. Anne was atop most Happy Bucks. Ev says "Mosaic Man" is returning.....WAIT FOR IT! The red-headed "What am I? Chopped Liver!" got to finally compliment Anne. Sher gave Bill leaving early and another for the loser. "It's really nice to see where our money goes!" Thanks Anne.
