Robert advised that Nanaimo is the 10th oldest community in Canada. Therefore with the growing



a shortage of available beds for the patients. Travellers Lodge is the only facility that is exclusively for dementia patients. It currently has 90 beds and has been in operation for 35 years. Travellers Lodge will expand to 130 beds in its new location on Northfield Road currently under construction. The buildings, upon completion, will total 105,000 square feet situated on 5 acres, with the infrastructure in place to expand the facility significantly in the future. Tours of the construction site are scheduled monthly with the next tour scheduled February 6th @ 1:00 pm.

The new facility will be known as Eden Gardens and will be operated as a not for profit society also registered federally as

a charitable organization. Island Health will subsidize the cost of operations although each patient is obliged to pay \$900 to \$3,300 per month based on their respective income.

Eden Gardens is designed based on a successful model used in the USA, which attempts to emulate neighbourhoods. Each floor has a central atrium with 11 rooms on each side as well as a dedicated kitchen. This configuration has proven to provide the greatest quality of life for the patients and helps combat the feelings of loneliness, boredom and helplessness which are so prevalent in those individuals diagnosed with dementia.

Robert advised that they have a \$2 million capital and \$100,000 operations fundraising goal.
