Raising Awareness About Area 4 Rotary...

The objective is to have one full page dedicated to Rotary in the Nanaimo Bulletin, once a month. Sponsorship will pay for the page, each of the five clubs would be responsible for finding 3 sponsors for a six month period. The cost to each sponsor (based on 15 sponsors) would be \$60 an ad per month (+ a \$5.25 ePaper charge + GST) or \$391.25 for six months. If this goes ahead as planned it will begin in April.

Black Press has a Circulation/distribution is 32,000 copies (I have a breakdown of where papers are distributed)

- Estimated readership has a 'two times multiplier' effect so estimated viewership can range from 45,000 to 62,000+ (depending on how many papers are picked up and shared)
- Distribution goes from Nanoose Bay to Ladysmith

The Rotary moment focused on the eradication of the wild Polio virus in Africa, first announce in August of this year by the World Health Organization.

Presentation:

Elaine Parker, Executive Director of Nanaimo Science (former NS3) provided a presentation about a year ago. At that time the organization was known as the Nanaimo Science and Sustainability Society, a difficult name for the children they serve.



The mission of the society is; to inspire children and develop interest in science and sustainability through hands-on learning. Delivered through programs such Science in the Park, a free summer series engaging families in science. this is delivered in city parks. during 2020 (COVID) the program did reduced capacity but had over 900 participants. "Science Saturday" is held in local schools in February, gathering over 30 organizations focused on science and sustainability. Past years have seen 500 visitors in one day. School programs support teachers in grades 2 and 5,6, 7. The program ended in 2020 as a response to COVID. There was also the loss of access to the science studio for this reason. Current programs are focused outdoors and a new location in the Country Club Centre. The future will focus on outdoor education. for additional information finding out about programs call 778-268-2289 or nanaimoscience.org. The society is still looking for an permanent "science centre".



Nanaimo Science is funded by grants, BC Gaming, and service agreements. it was suggested that perhaps Nanaimo Science could be a participant in our club's 25th anniversary project.
