In his first official meeting as president of Nanaimo Daybreak Rotary, Daryl was off camping! Our new VP Doug O. ably stepped in and began the meeting with the land acknowledgement and O Canada with Rod.

Valri gave us two inspiring quotes for the inspiration. "When you give joy to other people, you get more joy in return." "The purpose of life is a life of purpose." Graham coordinated the introduction of visiting Rotarians and guests. Paul Manly from Nanaimo Rotary was introduced. For her Rotary moment, Donna talked about how Rotary has given her meaningful opportunities to be involved with children.



Graham has been working with a group called Creating Opportunities for Guatemalans. A 13-yearold boy in Guatemala needed an endocrine test and treatment. The costs for these were \$650 and the board approved this. Duane, as part of his Rotary Friendship Exchange, attended a meeting with the Rotary Club of Milano Cordusio, Italy and brought back a club banner. Cathy M. will be the councilor for one of the Rotary Youth Exchange students, Laura Brandsborg is from Denmark and will be arriving at 6:28 PM at the Nanaimo airport on August 23. If

anyone is interested in greeting Laura when she arrives, Cathy invited you to show up! Doug L. announced that the Oktoberfest committee will be meeting at 5 at Wolf Brewing on Monday, July 8. Editor update: this meeting has been moved to the Landlubber Pub. Jeff announced that the poker tournament will be held on July 28 at Moose Hall.





Our guest speaker Paul Manly was introduced by Rick. Paul gave us the history of the Unitarian Shelter. It started as a cold weather shelter 15 years ago and in 2018, it became a full-time shelter. The doors open at 5 PM and the people who use the shelter must leave by 7:30 AM and stay at least four blocks away



no use the shelter must leave by 7:30 AM and stay at least four blocks away during the day. These hours were set up because the shelter is across the street from an elementary school and the hours have worked very well. Paul talked about how Nanaimo has one of the worst ratios of shelter beds to identified homeless in Canada. There are only 69 beds in Nanaimo and in the last attempt to quantify the number of homeless in Nanaimo, 515 people were identified. 27 of Nanaimo's beds are in the Unitarian Shelter so it is a very important shelter for our community. Paul explained that there are lots of seniors and people who have lost their rental places. The building has needed a lot of upgrades and there will be a grand re-opening on July 13th. Paul invited us to attend. One of the new renos was an accessible washroom with a shower. One of the programs run by the shelter is a Green Team which cleans up trash in the neighborhood twice a month. The shelter is now being run by Nanaimo Family Life.

We sang Happy Birthday to Hillary. Bill had Ken pull the 50/50 ticket and Ken pulled his own ticket! Wayne had Doug O. collect happy bucks and we concluded with the four way test.
