Over the next 24 years, he has held most positions in his Club and District. Alex proposed Marnie for membership in 2002. They are multiple Paul Harris Fellows, Bequest Society Members and Benefactors.

District Governor Alex's opened his talk with a humorous story from his Highway Patrol days on a motorcycle. (Too bad our President Dave wasn't here to reminisce on biking and embalming!) He then asked whether we had any dentist's as a member? Surprisingly, there are only two on Vancouver Island. Several ideas were put forward by our members, which created several chuckles. Alex's first task was to present a special pin to our Bruce Mede, recognizing him for always encouraging our members in having fun.

commodity in sports, public institutions and private corporations. Let we Rotarians set the example. The Four Way Test should be used and promoted whenever possible. Upcoming in Rotary, the 2010 Conference in Montreal will highlight 100 years of Rotary becoming an international organization. (Sgt at Arms, will there be fines to those who don't know the first Club outside USA?)

Marnie Alexander then spoke on the RCMP Bear that she won at the District Governors Conference. She noted Alex's goal of donating 150 Shelter Boxes from our District. Marnie then related a story of a young girl and her dream to play ball with the other kids in the playground. Her mother asked the two Moses Lake WA. Clubs whether Rotary could help? Help they did, and she developed a "Universally Accessible Playground." (UAP) Can we add to an existing playground? Small steps, small pieces will add immeasurably to the opportunities for everyone to gain access. Everyone going to the park will benefit.

Governor Alex closed with some of Michael Josephson's quote of "What will matter:

Is not what you learned, but what you taught,  
Is not your competence, but your character,  
Is not your memories, but the memories that live in those who loved you,  
Chose to live a life that matters, and have fun while doing it.

He then talked about the Polio endemic countries, Pakistan, Afghanistan, India & Nigeria, which spells a surprising acronym: PAIN. Suppressing polio has proven and will continue to be a PAIN in these countries. National Immunization Days cover 170 million people. Uttar Pradesh State in India has 500,000 births per month. Each child, under five, must receive at least two doses of the oral polio vaccine. A daunting task indeed.

Governor Alexander talked about how Rotary International President John Kenny advised on promoting our Rotary Activities, and how he was impressed by the support of our Vancouver Island print, radio and television media. This year, it is hoped that District 5020 can increase our capacity to do service by increasing our giving to more than \$1 Million (US) Consider Rotarians worldwide: only 26% contribute to Foundation, while 76% of our District members contribute. Something to be proud about! RI President's John's goal is to increase our worldwide membership, optimize the RI Leadership talent, and for our Clubs to have more members at the end of the year, and to retain more than 80% of last years members. Remember, "The Future of Rotary is in your Hands." Alex spoke of the lack of truthfulness in all sectors of our society: how cheating in schools is acceptable, how truth is a limited
