Don Bonner has been out to the Farm at Cedar Woods <http://thefarmatcedarwoods.ca/> to assess the fencing project. They apparently need 1200 feet of wire fencing, and another 350 of wood fencing. Maybe too much work, but is considering asking another Club to do part of the project. News coming via email later.

Dave Thompson has not received any applications for our donation of the excess funds, so, no report.

Neil Sorsdahl is back and is now talking up our major Spring Classic "Golf fore Kids" fundraiser on 12 June, 1:00 start, cost \$140, with \$50 charitable receipt to participants. Great event, and we need your help to find sponsors before 1 May, to include them in our promotional material. Note too, they will also be promoted on our website.

Nelson was our speaker and his topic was World Community Service (WCS). He thanked Jeff Boegel for adding some coherency to his power point presentation. Our Club budgets \$5,000 annually for our international projects. He wishes to increase that to \$8K.

The Mid-Island WCS group now has 19 Clubs, each contributing \$550 for their projects. The advantage is that \$10K creates much larger projects, with higher impact. They meet monthly at the School Board office and you are welcome to attend their deliberations.

Over the past years, they have accomplished 8 projects in 6 countries and leveraged \$20,000 into \$205,000 USD

- 2007 Bolivia, supporting 24 families to grow & sell vegetables
- 2008 Ghana, drilled water well
- 2008 Mexico, backup power unit for hospital
- 2009 Sunyani Ghana, security fence around public school
- 2009 Uganda, latrine & rain water collection system

Nelson said they and our Club have developed Five Year Strategic Plans, along with the capable help of our Ken Hammer. Check out the website for details.

Patrick then spoke on another project, much closer to home. With the recent promotion by Oak Bay Rotary Club, we were educated on several projects around Lake Atitlan, Guatemala. There are several Mayan villages in the area. They are a pre-industrial society.

One project includes provision of locally made wood cooking stoves (O'Neil Stoves) that use less, scarcely available, wood, prevents burns, and ducts the smoke to the outdoors. Teams educate and help put the stoves together, costing \$100.

Another involves a dental health programme, with a top quality portable dental unit located and available to any visiting dentist. Teams can go down for several weeks and have a positive impact on their long term health.

They also have education, community support programmes, micro-credit. Check out their blogspot <http://www.icoatitlan.blogspot.ca/>

Lastly, consider, compared to Ghana, considerably less travel time in the air and on the ground, and much cheaper. Flying return to Tegucigalpa Airport cost around \$1,000. Then a few hours later, you are in the villages.
