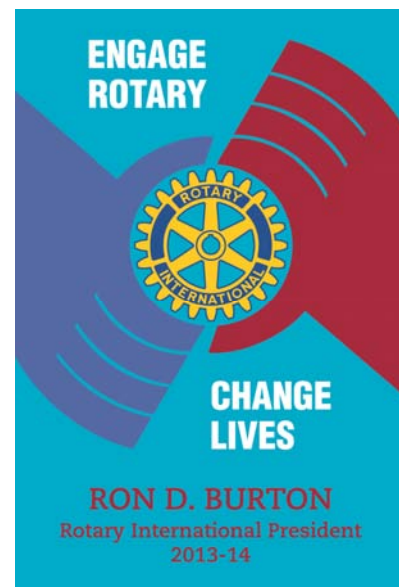

The clinic opened in October 2011. Financial support has been provided by the city if Nanaimo, the United Way and Mid-island Co-op. In addition, Murray Boston of Sinclair Dental donated used dental equipment that he had from clinics he had provided new

equipment for. The landlord also contributed some free rent during the start up period. The office is about 1000 square feet and consists of a reception area, three chairs and a small staff area. The office was renovated by volunteers using donated building supplies. The clinic has a strategic alliance with Nanaimo Volunteer and Information Services Society of Nanaimo.

After the first year of operations the following statistical information was gathered:

Patients served	375

65% have no insurance; the balance have insurance provided by Social Services. In the first year, the services, if billed pursuant to the fee schedule, would have totaled \$91,867.47. They collected \$27,375.27 thus providing a benefit of \$64,492.20 to the community. Currently the clinic is only open one day a week and there is a long line up before it opens. The demand is there for the clinic to be open more but limited funding and volunteers don't allow it.

In 2013, they hope to connect with the Dental Hygiene program @ VIU and provide opportunities for the students to obtain practical experience. Jim also indicated that, currently, they are only able to provide emergency services dealing with pain through extraction. In future, they would like to expand the services provided. The clinic has need for a new chair cost \$7,000, a kit of dental tools cost \$3,000 and a high speed sterilizer cost \$7,000 as well.

Doug advised the Jim will be receiving an award from the BC Dental Association in March of this year for his volunteer work.
