

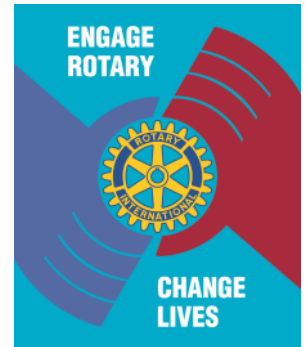

Rotarian Sanjivan Mahara intro's the VIU Guests. Eight VIU Nursing grads are going to Nepal for five weeks as global citizens and to asses neonatal programmes.

Nepal is landlocked between China and India. 1 in 190 pregnancies have complications. 42 in 1,000 children die before age five. (Compared to 4 in 1,000 Canada) Also, 17.6 % of all sexually active persons between 15-19 use prophylaxis. The goal of the VIU Nurses is to do maternal and health promotion using cultural sensitivity.

They are consulting with Family and Planning Association of Nepal (FPAN <http://www.fpan.org/>) has five areas of focus: Advocacy, Adolescent, HIV/AIDs, Abortion and Access.

The VIU nurses will present their research project in the Fall of this year. Their goal is to learn where they can best help, be it with better education, financial aid for FPAN's work and/or culturally sensitive sexual and reproductive health and teaching materials.

Yes to the question, they have submitted a request to our Funds Allocation Committee. Chair Nelson Allen also invited them to present to the Mid Island Group of World Community Service (20 Mid Island Rotary Clubs (MIG WCS)

Mike Walker shared that he was also Chair of VIU Foundation and was surprised that he had never heard of our Swing into Spring support for VIU music students. He pledged future support for our fundraiser from the Foundation. With that said, Dave noted that he would pass on those kind words to our Swing into Spring Co-Chairs Randall Taylor and Rod Mont. (?)



Jeff Boegel reiterated the Spring Poker Tourney will be held in Nanoose Bay Library to accommodate players in the Parksville Qualicum. Doors open at 6:30 and cards drop at 7:00. Ron and Graham Calder will handle the bar. Don & Bev Bonner will cater. Jeff needs hands to do Front of House & Registration. Lastly, we need one more sponsor for \$500.
