Rotary Minute

Karin Mattern discussed the history of Women in Rotary. Forty years ago, a Rotary club in California inducted three women into their club. Rotary International reacted to this flagrant breach of rules by revoking their charter. The club continued to meet under the name the X Rotary Club. In 1987, Rotary International finally changed the Rotary Constitution and allowed women into Rotary. Karin brought to our attention that one-third of our club members are female, but advised that she would like to that ratio increase.

Neil informed the club that even though he will be moving in 8 days he is continuing to solicit sponsorships for the golf tourney scheduled for May 26/17. Neil provided several examples of sponsorship opportunities, and encouraged all members to just ask. Neil also advised that we are looking for silent auction prizes for the golf tourney as well.

Guest Speakers

Kelly McBride is the acting executive director for the Central Vancouver Island Multicultural Society (CVIMS). She advised that CVIMS began operations in 1979, in response to the displaced Vietnamese refugees arriving in our community, and that they a not-for-profit charitable society. Their Mission Statement: We are leaders in providing services to our community, with a focus on newcomers. We are committed to promoting the values of equity, diversity, inclusion and respect for all peoples. Kelly advised that programs that they operate include Linc (Language instruction for newcomers to Canada), Employment services, Youth Groups including the Hippy Program which is designed to assist preschoolers to get ready for school. In addition, complimentary daycare is provided for the children of any parents enrolled in their programs. The society employs 35 paid staff including five teachers and is assisted by over 200 volunteers. The see about 700 newcomers per year. Funding is provided by both the provincial as well as federal governments. In addition, they also solicit private funding to maintain their programs. 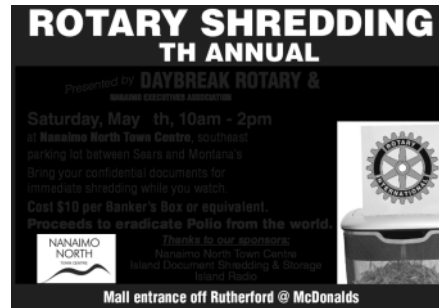
