Guest Speaker – Rober Grouse – Eden Gardens

Eden Gardens is for dementia care. By 2025, 5 thousand people on the island will suffer from dementia. It is projected that, by 2038, 1 million Canadians will be affected by dementia. 1 out 5 baby boomers will be affected and a 2 to 1 ratio for women compared to men
A total of 995 subsidized beds in the area. Nanaimo 673 beds and Parksville 321. Eden Gardens new facility on Northfield Road, 100% for dementia care with 200 beds subsidized. Their philosophy is to create a neighborhood feeling; they have gardens, bistro and gift shop. They have day programs, daybreak and stepping stones, for care givers that require a break from being a care giver. Volunteers are needed throughout the year. Robert gave a big thank you to the Rotary clubs in Nanaimo for their time, effort, commitment and donations.
