Guests at this morning's meeting were Julie Bevan, Executive Director of the Nanaimo Art Gallery and Deborah Zorkin who is President of the Board for the Art Gallery. Also with us at the meeting were our exchange-students Koko and Bea. This week saw the return of Graham, Patrick and Ron from their annual trek to Guatemala. Sergeant at Arms then assigned table order and breakfast began.

A Rotary Minute was provided by Kris Rongve, who encouraged members to sign up for one of the four Fireside Chat gatherings to be held over the next two weeks. Check your email for details sent by Ev Boegh with sign-up sheets.

San provided gave a quick outline of the project to repair the Tri-Ratna school in Nepal. The total amount needed for this project is \$60,000. To date there are committed funds and grants providing over \$30,000. for the project. Photos have been sent to club members by email from the club "Secretary" and a detailed explanation of the funding sent by email from Ev.

Presentation:

Julie Bevan use pictures and words to show how the Nanaimo Art Gallery has been transformed to expand the range of art and artists in presentation. This includes the launch of Nanaimo Art Gallery's first major publication *Black Diamond Dust*. The publication expands on the contemporary art exhibition of the same name. *Black Diamond Dust* refers to coal mining, an industry that formed and fragmented communities on the Island. Other offerings from the Art Gallery include Spring Break Art Camp which encourages children to express themselves and "Artist in the School", a program reaching 11,000 students annually.

Dazzle Camouflage is a four week summer program for teens which provides an understanding of contemporary art and self expression. The Art Gallery has a role in building understanding and "bridges" between aboriginal people and the rest of the community. There are tours for "members only" through the gallery. See Ken Hammer for information about becoming a member. Julie suggests we pop-in to the gallery if you are looking to slow down for awhile or to create a mental-shift, or just to enjoy the displays.

Draws and final announcements:

Patrick returned from Guatemala with a Rotary club banner for exchange. The banner is from the club of Antigua Monumental. This club does not yet have its charter so operates as a satellite of a Rotary club from California.

Dawne Anderson let us know that the Salvation Army has opened a new "furniture only" store on Mostar Road.

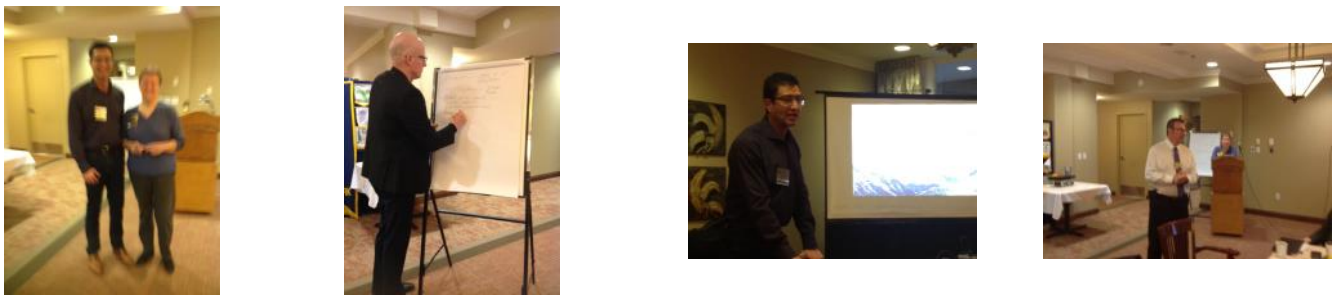
