Guest Speaker this week Rob Rose of Bellevue, Washington...

Robert Rose is founder/president of *The Rose International Fund for Children (TRIFC)*, a non-profit organization helping people with disabilities in Nepal. Rob started TRIFC to help educate, empower and provide opportunities for people with disabilities in Nepal. He is also owner of *Brant Photographers* in Bellevue, Washington a small, family portrait studio which has been in Bellevue since 1949.

Rob joined Bellevue Rotary Club in 1986 and is a past-president of the club. He was awarded the 'Service Above Self' award by Rotary International in 2007, has twice been awarded as the 'Rotarian of the Year' by his club and was awarded the 'District 5030 Rotarian of the Year' in 2009.



In 1997 Rob read an article about an organization that was helping impoverished children living in Nepal. He felt compelled to call and volunteer as a photographer to help document the wonderful work they were doing. That one call started a cascade of events that has led to a volunteer odyssey spanning twenty-one years and dozens of Rotary projects helping children and adults with disabilities in Nepal.

- 80% of their export revenue in Malawi is agriculture or 1/3 of their GDP
- Youth involvement in agriculture is the goal, bringing aid to help relieve some of the poverty.
- They are behind in part because the government is not supporting this initiative.
- Youth come together as groups to help support each other and promote food production.

Some of her personal challenges – she is:

White and female, culture shock, religion.

Some of her Successes:

Learning to interact and work in a brand new cultural setting, Self growth, Getting the opportunity to discuss cultural differences with locals, Contributing to the progression of a really important cause in Malawi, Getting to see a new part of the world, such an incredible country.
