Our Meeting was held at Tillicum Lelum Aboriginal Friendship Centre. Tammy Myles of Tillicum Lelum sang & drummed the Coast Salish National Anthem gifted from Chief Dan George. Guests included Management Team Claudio Aguilera, Rickey Wylie, and Avery, granddaughter of Tammy/daughter of Rickey.

Bonnie Murrel's invocation asked that we find virtue not faults in others.

Notes: Next Tuesday Rotary Youth Exchange (RYE) fundraiser at Cavalotti Lodge 6:00 PM. RYE student Doreen from Netherlands will stay with Rod & Gill for next five months and she is preparing her list of wants to see and do. Julian from Columbia on Friday and Aiu from Japan arrives Saturday.

Rod discussed the changing buddy system that will include threesomes to ensure continuity with changing members.

50/50 Don Bonner splurged spent the whole five bucks. Luck was with him and his ticket was pulled. Unfortunately, he wasted his money.

Our presenter **Rickey Wylie** is with Tillicum Lelum Aboriginal Friendship Center and she described programs that bridge the gap between indigenous peoples and the community. She's Program coordinator children youth programs 6-16, employs youth, other groups working on making school a comfortable environment transitioning from the home to school. With youth and family, summer is the time to maintain programs, after school programs, daycare, kids and help family grow with their schooling, (We invited four students to Rotary youth Ex dinner to see opportunities that we provide. (Rickey is former student of Ken))

Tillicum Lelum Aboriginal Friendship Centre started in 1964 and was incorporated in 1968. Their role is to promote justice, fairness and equality for Aboriginal people and their holistic programming and services. Most of us didn't realize the Aboriginal Friendship Centre works with about 10,000 Urban Snuneymuxw First Nations not living on reserve.

Tillicum is a non-profit and operates on \$6,000,000 budget. Money is difficult to come by. Nurses make \$10 less than Island Health staff. Wages are kept low, thus allowing the society to survive. The centre operates over 30 programs for youth to elders, building better babies to youth drop-in, summer camps to family support. They also promote staff wellness.

Construction of the new Centre was a really big task, huge risk, money available in 2015 was 500K and building cost 2.2M, leaving them with \$1.7M mortgage. Didn't get community support they thought they would, aboriginal head start funding, took over Barsby infant daycare in September, after school care etc, baby college for kindergarten to prep them for school. Kids profit and are on par with most students. Support throughout their life is required. Residential schools created three generations of disfunction. Some are doing well, but with many, violence and addiction are more intense. Harder to help them because the government mandates they can only be helped in the place where they belong. They must go to their specific first nation for support. You need community to support a child. Easier to raise healthy children than to fix a broken adult. Connection is correction" said Jane Moss. The Gathering Place has grown to 50 full-time staff and 45 on call and they also run training programs with VIU, Corrections Canada and careers programs.

Rickey closed with Indigenous people taught to be humble, so difficult to promote ourselves.

That being said, we toasted to Rotary and went on to our next adventure.
