Whatever you're doing in Rotary, keep doing it. You can create lasting change in yourself, across the country and around the world. Our future is about our youth. Our youth take all of the messages of goodness and peace back to their home clubs. Keep doing what you're doing in Rotary for the future. Move the needle forward in your own way!
